Six Organizations Receive Grants from Greater Cedarburg Foundation

CEDARBURG—The Greater Cedarburg Foundation (GCF) has awarded \$120,000 to six area non-profit organizations as part of its annual grant cycle process.

“We are grateful to the donors whose generosity has made these grants possible,” said Joe Rintelman, GCF grant committee chairperson. “Thanks to their support, we were able to award significant grants to six worthy organizations that are making a meaningful impact in our community.”

Organizations receiving grants for the 2022 annual GCF grant cycle review include:

- **Cedarburg Art Museum** to repair the roof fascia and exterior of the historic building, a valuable asset in Cedarburg’s downtown
- **Cedarburg Cultural Center** to upgrade facilities at the Kuhefuss House Museum, allowing additional programming on-site
- **Cedarburg Friends of Park and Recreation** to achieve the fundraising goal for the extensive renovation of the All Children’s Playground in Cedarburg
- **Family Promise of Ozaukee County** to furnish one room in the emergency shelter for individuals and families at risk for homelessness
- **Ozaukee Family Services** to help expand programs and services to the community through its relocation into a larger facility in the Town of Cedarburg
- **Riveredge Nature Center** to support the “Growing Adventures for the Future: The Campaign for Riveredge” capital campaign

“Cedarburg is filled with people who are committed to making our community a special place to live, and we are pleased to support these organizations that are helping Cedarburg and its residents to flourish,” said Mark Langholz, GCF President.

The Greater Cedarburg Foundation’s mission is to preserve the local cultural heritage, enhance artistic endeavors and support educational, social and community-based services in the Greater Cedarburg area.

Since its inception, the Greater Cedarburg Foundation has awarded more than \$1.6 million in grants to deserving projects and nonprofit organizations in the community.
